Example: You work at Salvatore's Pizza and your manager has learned you study GIS at Monroe Community College. They have asked you to make a map of all their restaurant locations using ArcGIS Pro.

Materials needed: Spreadsheet of Salvatore's locations

Steps:

- 1. Obtain address data for Salvatore's locations (provided as an Excel spreadsheet)
- 2. Open Salvatore's spreadsheet, examine data, then close

- 3. Go to https://maps.monroecounty.gov/Html5Viewer2/index.html?viewer=Parcel_Viewer#
- 4. Click on "I want to..." and then click "Geocode"





5. Click on Choose File and navigate to where your Salvatore's address spreadsheet is saved, click on it, and click next



6. Fill out each of the fields to match the fields in your spreadsheet (Address field on website should match Address field in spreadsheet, etc.)

7. Click continue and let the geocoding process run.



8. Once complete, you will see 30 points on the map website in Monroe, Livingston, Wayne, and Ontario counties



9. Click on the panel drop down next to results and scroll down to export to CSV, click ok

10. Open exported CSV table, examine data, then close

11. Open ArcGIS Pro, open a Blank Map Template and create a name for your new project.

12. Under Map tab, click Add Data, and then click XY Point Data

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- 13. For input table, navigate to the folder where your exported CSV is (likely your Downloads folder) and click it
- 14. Remaining settings are fine as their default values

15. Click run

- 16. After the tool runs, you should now see points on your map, these points should look familiar to the points from step 8 they are your restaurant locations!
- 17. Rename your new point layer to Salvatore's Locations (click once in the contents pane on your points name until the cursor appears, then you can type the new name)

18. Change your symbology – double click on your point symbol in the contents pane to open symbology properties

- 19. Click on your point symbol again when the symbology menu opens, then on the gallery menu, search for "food"
 - a. Pick one of the restaurant symbols and then close the symbology menu

20. Under Insert tab, click new layout, and click 8.5x11 landscape

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21. Click Map Frame, and click on the map frame that shows your basemap/points

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22. Draw a box in the white space on the map layout to add your map frame to this screen

23. Change scale to 1:300000

- 24. Insert north arrow, pick your favorite symbol, draw a box on your map to insert
- 25. Insert scale bar, pick your favorite style, draw a box on your map to insert
- 26. Increase scale bar size to make your increments round numbers

27. Insert title by clicking the A in the graphics and text group (NOT the giant A that says dynamic text), then draw a box

- 28. Give your map a title
- 29. Save
- 30. Under share tab, click the layout export button with the green arrow

31. Save as PDF, navigate to folder you want your PDF saved to, give document a name

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- 32. Click Export at the bottom of the menu
- 33. Once it's done running, navigate to the location where you saved the PDF open document to see your final map!

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
