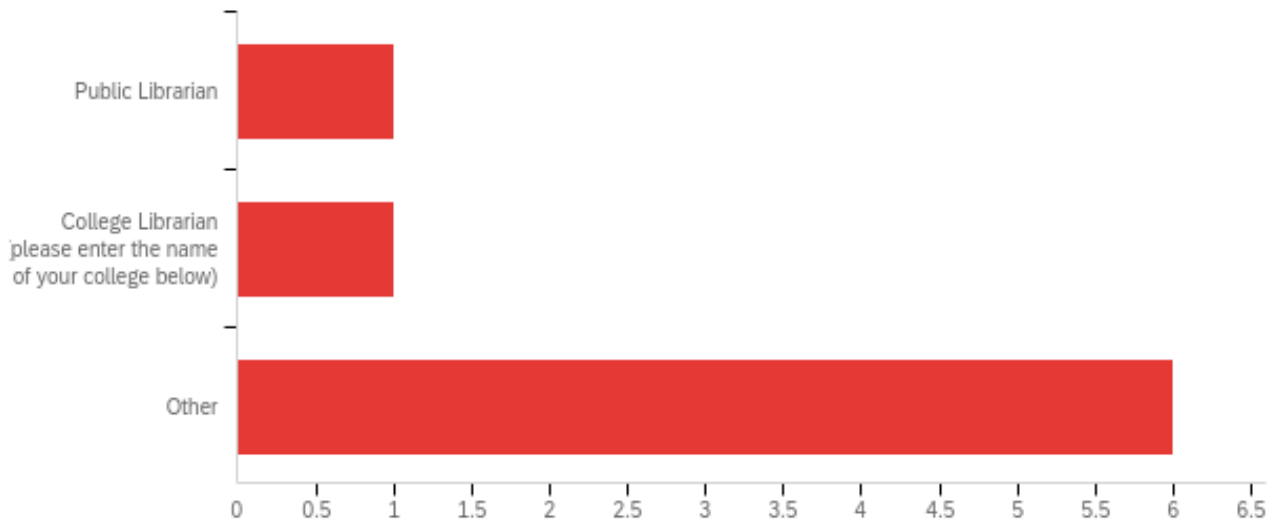

I've had a little prior experience with StoryMaps, so I got deeply into creating one in this workshop. It's difficult with the hands-on portion of a workshop to help people at varying levels of skill and comfort with technology and tools. I'd love to participate in a longer, more in-depth workshop.
