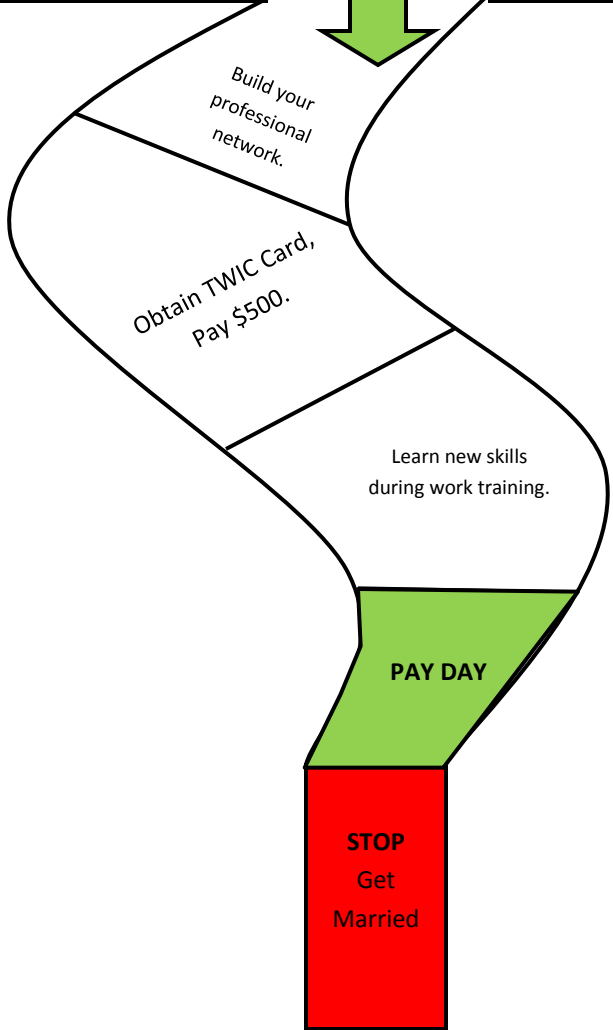
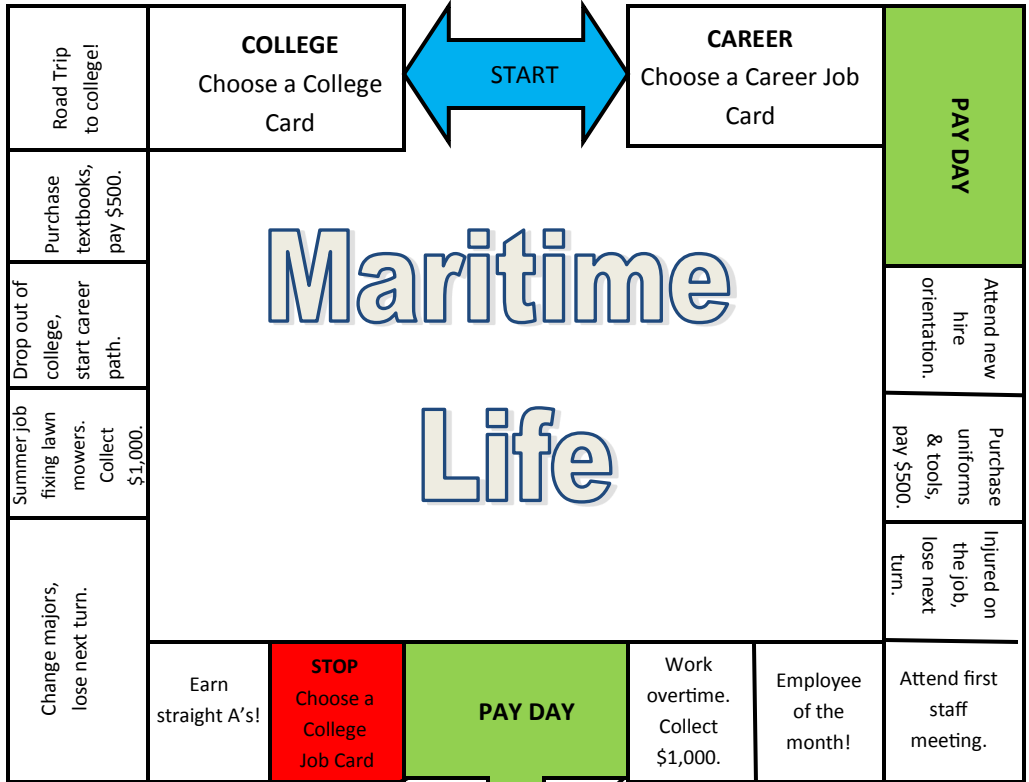
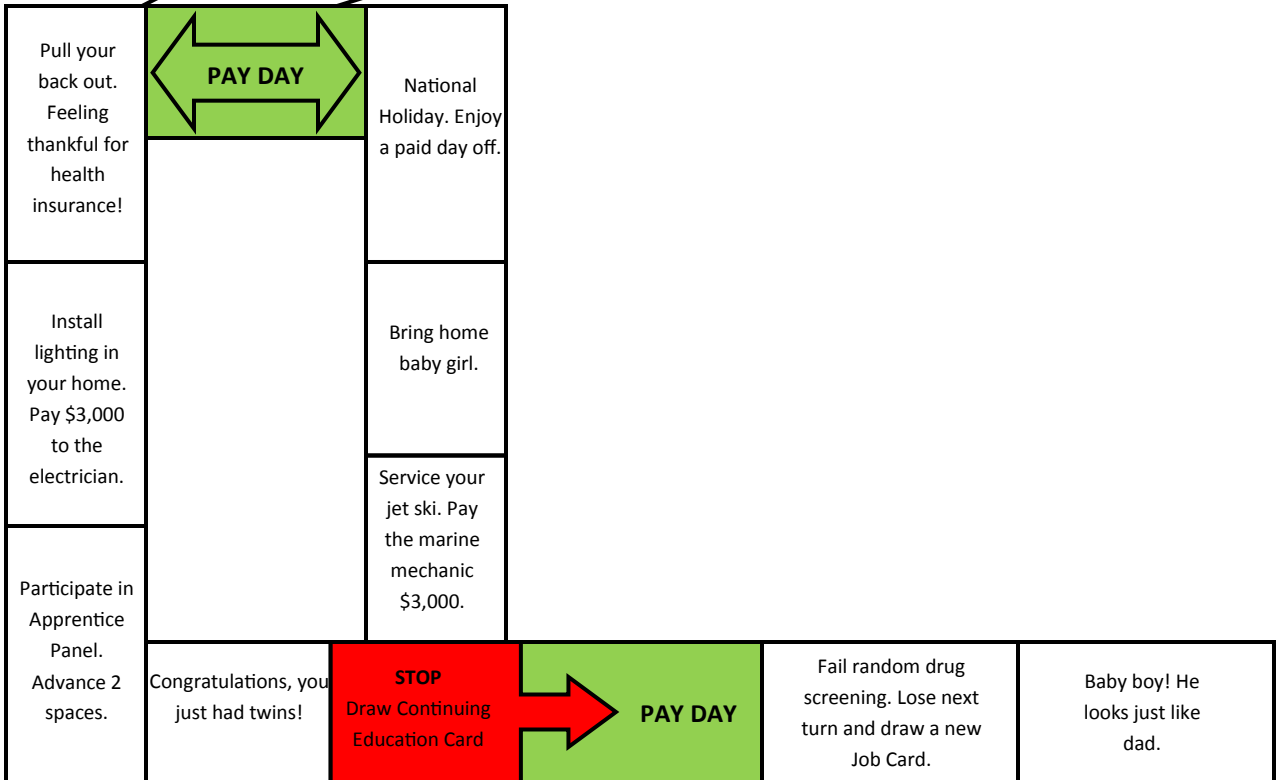
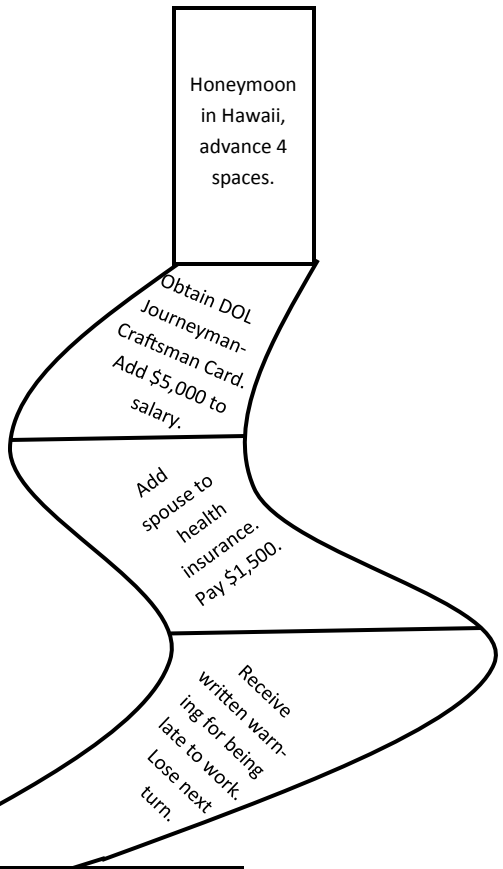


Game Rules

1. The player with the next upcoming birthday will go first. Begin by choosing College or Career pathway and drawing a College Card or Career Job Card. College pathway will draw a College Job Card later when prompted.
2. If choosing a College Card, shuffle deck, then draw a card, read it aloud, and keep it for the duration of the game. Record the amount of debt incurred on the repayment card found with the printable money. Then roll die to take first turn.
3. College debt can be repaid at the beginning of any turn.
4. If choosing a Career Job Card, shuffle deck, draw a card, read it aloud, and keep it for the duration of the game. Your salary is assigned, medians are listed for educational reference. Then roll die to take first turn.
5. Visit: <https://www.freeonlinedice.com/#dice> and click "Roll It" to determine the number of spaces to move forward. Move the given number of spaces and follow the directions on the space you land on.
6. Each time you pass a PAY DAY space, collect the salary given on your Job Card.
7. Printable money is included or can be tracked on paper or with a calculator.
8. Each time you reach a red space, stop and follow the directions, then your turn has ended.
9. Continuing Education Cards simulate advancing your career through further education and training. Depending on your given level of education from your Job Card, you will have the chance to increase your salary. Shuffle cards, have the player choose 1, read it aloud, follow instructions to adjust salary, then insert the card back into the deck.
10. Payment is given to the bank unless specified to go to another player. If that player is not in the game, money will be paid to the bank instead.
11. Money collected is paid from the bank.
12. To add family members, draw one or more dots on your game piece as family members are added.
13. If you have not repaid college debt by retirement, add \$10,000 to debt cost to account for interest, then repay debt. Total remaining earnings. You may not continue to collect money once you've reached retirement. The player with the highest earnings is the winner.

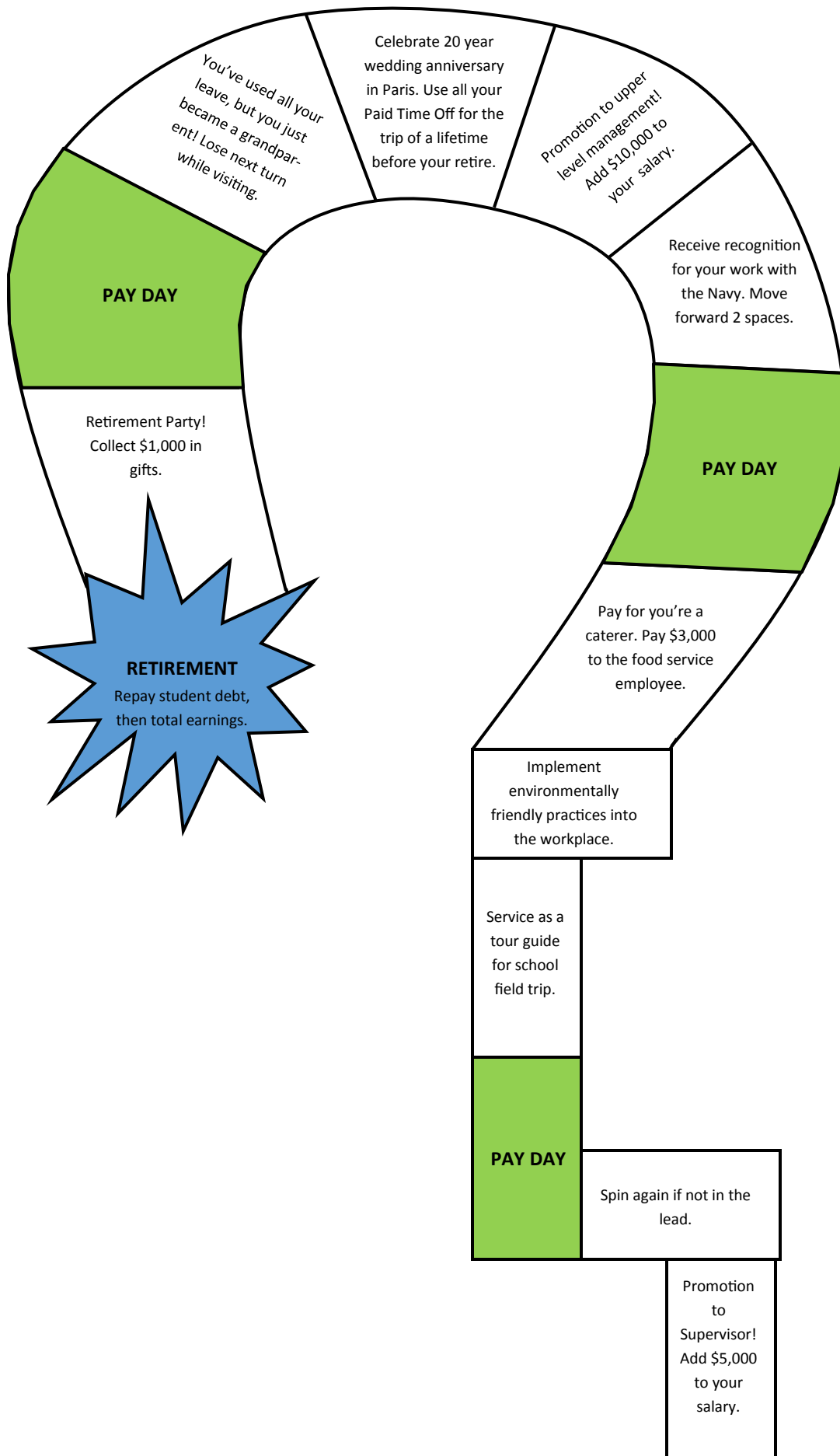

Unlicensed Junior Engineer/Qualified Member of the Engine Department (QMED)**

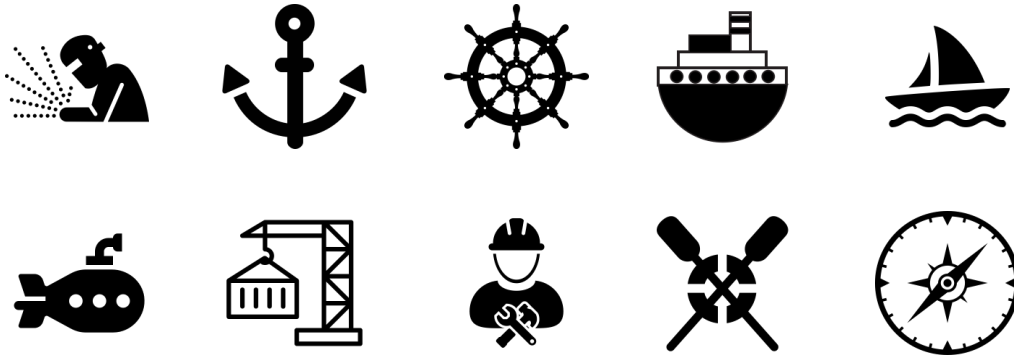
