- A team must perform well at both activities in order to win the Challenge





Judging Criteria - Capitol Hill

Does the display

- Identify a societal need;
- Communicate the innovation's novelty, feasibility, and market viability; and
- Substantiate the innovation's ability to produce measureable benefits?

Does the team

- Exhibit enthusiasm;
- Ask questions of visitors and actively listen to answers; and
- Align their responses and interactions to the interests of the audience?





Do the team's interactions

- Convincingly champion their innovation's value and significance;
- Reflect positively on their team and their institution; and
- Convey a roadmap for moving the project forward?



Judging Criteria - Final Presentation

Does the presentation

- Clearly identify the societal problem, need, or opportunity that the innovation addresses?
- Concisely explain how the idea solves this problem, meets the need, or pursues the opportunity?
- Actively urge the listener to support further development of the idea?
- Tell a complete, persuasive story that clearly conveys the innovation's value and viability?

Travel Arrangements

- Make your own
- AACC supports the cost of travel for all participants
 - Maximum of \$1,200 reimbursement (in addition to hotel expenses)

Travel Reimbursements

- Reimbursable expenses include:
 - Airfare
 - Train or bus fare
 - Mileage allowance of \$0.535 per mile
 - Taxi/Shuttle or public transportation between airport/hotel
 - Baggage Fees
 - Parking
- Rental cars not usually allowable & require pre-authorization
- Travel reimbursement forms

Team Displays

Display Development Grants - \$200

- Computer models, slides, video
- Interactive models, prototypes
- Signs, photos, graphics, promo materials
- Shipping or checked baggage costs

Display Materials

- Graphics to mount to foam core board addressing problem, research, results, and proposed solution
- Models, prototypes
- Tools, software, or props
- Videos, slides, computer images
 (No more than 3 minutes and on a loop)



Team Displays

Display Materials Provided
8'x 10' display/presentation space
6' foot table
ID sign - affixed to front of table
Tri-fold display board/tacks

Display Audiovisual


- Access to electricity

- Transportation of Displays
 - Shipping to hotel
 - Teams responsible for carrying materials to the Hill
- Size Restrictions
 - No bags/boxes larger than
 18" wide x 14" high x 8.5" deep
- Unallowable Items




- Student Original Work
