Insect Orders to Know

- 1. Collembola springtails
- 2. <u>Ephemeroptera</u> mayflies
- 3. Odonata dragonflies, damselflies, darners, gomphids, adders, skimmers
- 4. Orthoptera cockroaches, grasshoppers, crickets, katydids, praying mantids, walking sticks, locusts (NOTE: Your lab text has praying mantids in the Mantodea; cockroaches in Blattaria; and walkingsticks in Phasmatodea. I have combined these in Orthoptera as some sources do)
- 5. <u>Dermaptera</u> earwigs
- 6. <u>Isoptera</u> termites
- 7. <u>Thysanoptera</u> thrips
- 8. <u>Hemiptera</u> (True Bugs) squash bugs, plant or leaf bugs, stink bugs, harlequin bugs, assassin bugs, water boatmen, water bugs, water striders, leaf-footed bugs, wheel bugs, lace bugs, bed bugs, chinch bugs
- 9. Homoptera aphids, whiteflies, leafhoppers, cicadas, scales, mealybugs, psyllids
- 10. Neuroptera antlions (doodlebugs), lacewings, dobsonflies, alderflies, owlflies, snakeflies
- 11. Coleoptera beetles, weevils, lightningbugs (fireflies)
- 12. <u>Lepidoptera</u> butterflies, moths, skippers (remember the larvae forms corn borers, hornworms, etc.)
- 13. <u>Hymenoptera</u> ants, bees, wasps, sawflies, ichneumon wasps
- 14. <u>Diptera</u> flies, gnats, mosquitoes, midges
- 15. <u>Siphonaptera</u> fleas
